President Randy Domigan introduced Dan McBride, the 60-second Rotarian spotlight guest. Dan is the owner of Insignia Sign, Insignia Sign is a one-stop branding shop that can put your name on anything from apparel to vehicle graphics, Dan has worked with many fellow Rotarians, including Bill Nance and Lisa Wagner. To insure quality, Insignia does as much work in-house, and has recently acquired a printing company to deliver quality products to their customers in accurate timeframes. While the name of Dan's company is Insignia sign, they are, in fact a one-stop shop for print, merchandise branding and signage.

Lisa Grigsby was the Chair for the Day introducing Amanda DeLotelle of Miami Valley Meals. Amanda is the Executive Director of Miami Valley Meals, she holds a BA in telecommunications as well as BA in digital storytelling. After being furloughed from Kohler Catering in 2020 due to the pandemic, Amanda switched to community service by volunteering as part of an emergency culinary support team, which led to her role as Executive Director of Miami Valley Meals.

Amanda talked about her involvement with Miami Valley Meals and what the organization does for the community. One in seven individuals experience food insecurity while at the same time 40% of the food produced goes to waste. Question was, how do we bridge the gap? MVM works to bridge that gap by bringing food to those in need. The MVM chefs transform donated and rescued food into delicious and nutritious meals for those in need.

MVM was started by a group of chefs that were furloughed during the pandemic, initially they worked to support House of Bread, but, quickly, the word got around as to what they were doing and requests came to them to help other organizations. At first, things were a bit nomadic and chaotic with the group working wherever they could find space, such as at The Life Enrichment Center.

All of the meals for distribution are pre packaged in a professional manner with a full list of ingredients, packaged date, as well as lot numbers so everyone knows what is in their food. Each meal contains a protein, starch, vegetable and, of course, a dessert!

MVM has a network of over 50 partners who distribute the meals to those in need. The network partnerships are crucial because they know the neighborhood and the best way to distribute the meals to those in need. To date, 905,000 meals have been distributed to 126 partners in 37 zip codes.




