Sinclair Community College - or on Zoom **"International Peace Day"**



Former Dayton congressman and UN ambassador Tony Hall has worked to resolve some of the most challenging conflicts around the world in the last half century. He's dealt with blood diamonds, dictatorships in Romania and North Korea as well as the deadly civil war in Ethiopia that triggered a massive famine.

President Walt introduced our newest Rotary member, Trevor Collier, sponsored by current member Gerry Chadwick. Trevor is currently the Dean of the School of Business at the University of Dayton. He has an MA and a PhD in Economics from Southern Methodist University. Trevor, his wife and their three children live in Oakwood.

Kathleen Carlson introduced the Coats+ Project. A community service project to collect coats and uniforms for Dayton Leadership Academy and the Dayton Public School's McKinney-Vento Homeless Education project. The goal is to collect \$5000 to purchase items by November 15th. The Dayton Leadership Academy is a charter school that serves 1st – 8th graders. The McKinney-Vento Homeless Education project currently serves 250 students experiencing homelessness in Dayton Public Schools.

Bill Nance interviewed Chris Corba, Executive Director of League of Women Voters for a vocational profile. The League of Women Voters, a non-partisan organization, helps people understand who they're voting for and why. They provide the voters guide that is available in various local newspapers.

Adam Horseman introduced the speaker of the day, Josh Copeland. Josh is a motivational speaker from Fairborn, OH. He was a high school and college athlete who had to redefine himself after college sports ended. His journey led him to form "Learning to Cope" where he speaks to young people about mental health, getting ready for the workforce and a variety of topics. Josh led an engaging conversation about reasons young people leave a company and what the younger generation is looking for in a workplace. His observations include young people are looking for a flexible work schedule, opportunity for growth, up to date policies, transparency, wanting to feel valued, trust and diversity of people and of thought. He challenged the club to think about 'how can we be an employer people want to work for'.

NEW MEMBER PROFILE

Trevor C. Collier has served as Dean for the School of Business Administration at the University of Dayton since November of 2021. As Chief Academic Officer for the School of Business, he is responsible for the leadership of over 100 full-time faculty and staff, management of an annual operating budget of approximately \$25M, and oversees the academic affairs of approximately 2,600 undergraduate and graduate students, across eight undergraduate majors, an on-ground MBA program, an online MBA program, and three specialized masters' programs. Dr. Collier came to the University of Dayton in 2007 as an Assistant Professor of Economics. During his time as UD, he has served in many capacities, including as Chairperson for the Department of Economics and Finance and as Interim Dean for the School of Business. He published over a



dozen articles in peer-reviewed academic journals in labor economics, natural resource economics, and the economics of sport. Dr. Collier taught hundreds of students through his many courses at UD, including: Principles of Microeconomics, Public Finance, Environmental Economics and Managerial Economics (MBA). He holds a B.S. in economics from Centre College (KY) and an M.A. and a Ph.D. in economics from Southern Methodist University (TX). Trevor and his wife Katie reside in Oakwood and have three children.
