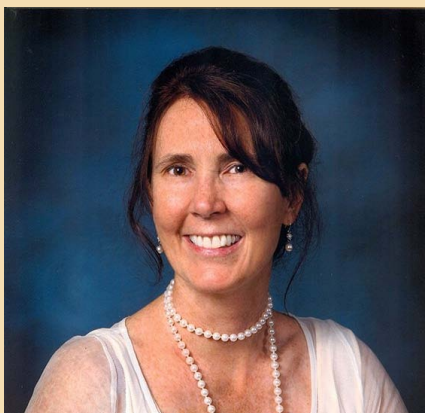

## Annual Fund

Gifts to the Rotary Foundation Annual Fund exceeded our goal of \$380,000. Rotarians gave over \$390,000 to the Annual Fund.

*\*Note- we have 2 non-giving clubs to the Annual Fund*

## Ukraine Relief Grant

Rotarians from District 6690 gave over \$61,000 to fund relief for the people of Ukraine.

## Polio Plus

Total giving to the Polio Plus Fund was substantial but below our goal of \$135,000.

*Note- we have 4 non-giving clubs to Polio Plus.*

## 125 Club Members

While Foundation giving was high overall, we fell short of our goal of 1,500 members donating at least \$100 to the Annual Fund



and \$25 to Polio Plus.

## Membership

We started the year with 59 clubs. We lost the Baltimore Club; We are finishing with 58 Clubs.

We started the year with 3221 members and currently sit at 3253 (+ 32!) The goal is 3589.
