Rotary International Partnerships



Rotary has multiple levels of Partnership with other organizations, which help RI to achieve a long term, lasting impact.

Most Rotarians know that RI is a leading partner in the Global Polio Eradication Initiative, along with the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, the World Health Organization, the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, UNICEF, and Gavi, the Vaccine Alliance.

Did you know that RI also has special partnerships in Clean Water, Sanitation & Hygiene and in Disaster Relief?

Clean Water, Sanitation & Hygiene

Rotary partners with United States Agency for International Development (USAID) to assist countries in providing safely managed water, sanitation and hygiene services, while sustainably managing water resources. Rotary also works with UNICEF to provide technical guidance in the development and implementation of our WASH in Schools Target Challenge. RI Foundation has invested \$148 Million in clean water, sanitation and hygiene globally, and in partnership with USAID has enabled 123 schools in Ghana to access basic sanitation and hygiene services, among many other projects.

Disaster Relief

Rotary and ShelterBox collaborate to provide emergency shelter and vital supplies to stabilize, protect, and support communities affected by disasters and humanitarian crises. Indeed, 90% of ShelterBox deployments involve local Rotarians, and Rotarians have donated \$48 million to ShelterBox.
