The speakers at the general sessions were amazing. We learned that there were only 12 cases of polio in the world in 2023, in just 2 countries – Pakistan and Afghanistan. With continued focus this disease can truly be eradicated. And through the “plus” part of Polio Plus, Rotary is using the same infrastructure to help monitor other diseases such as malaria, yellow fever and Ebola.

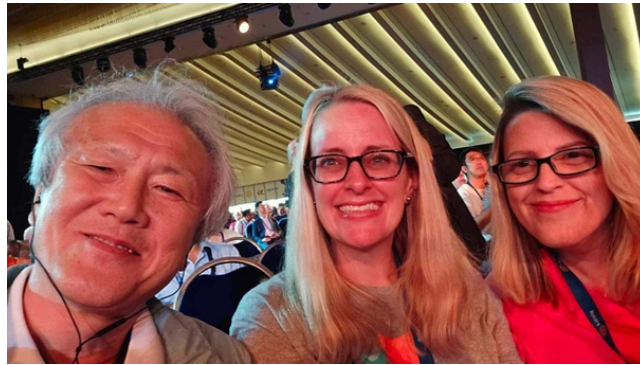


At the House of Friendship, we tried out virtual reality glasses and met with a number of organizations to learn about activities they are doing to create hope in the world. One organization we met with was Rise Against Hunger, which works with organizations like Rotary to host events to package meals to help combat hunger.



We made new friends, including Yu Daibong, past District Governor of District 3730 in South Korea. He was very interested in our plans to host a student from South Korea.

And we enjoyed the wonderful hospitality of the Rotary Club of Sentosa Singapore at the Host Hospitality Night. The Sentosa club does many service projects in Siem Reap, Cambodia. This includes providing over 1,100 bicycles so school children from rural areas can get to school, building 15 toilets so 650 school children do not have to share 1 toilet, and adopting 3 schools. They built a fruit orchard at one school, and digital labs at 2 schools. Remarkable work by incredibly generous and kind people - not to mention, they are a lot of fun!



Next year's convention will be held closer to home, in Calgary, Canada from June 21 to June 25, 2025. Consider attending, it's sure to be a memorable experience!
