

Club Meeting - January 26, 2012

Glen Stuckel gave the invocation, David Roth led the *Pledge* and baritone Greg Jebaily with pianist Sheldon Miller regaled us with a selection from *The Merry Widow*. President Stet welcomed visiting Rotarians and Sidonna Cox introduced the Birthday table. Paul Harris Fellows stood to welcome President-Elect Stuart Alexander, III, into their ranks.

Stet thanked Tuck Tinsley for the great Rotary Night Out at the American Printing House for the Blind, and he announced the next two events on Feb. 14 and March 2 are sold out. Craig Scherman reminded us to submit our Lifetime Service Award nominations by Feb. 2, and Gary Noel promoted the Feb. 11 Pocket Billiards Tourney at the Pendennis Club.

Kelly Burke introduced new member Donald Cherrie, President of Nimlok Co.; and Ken Grossman introduced our speaker, Ford Louisville Assembly Plant (LAP) Manager John Savona, who highlighted growth at Ford and the plant's impact on the local economy.



A new exterior of Fern Valley Road's 1955 plant only hints at the changes inside. The \$600 million demolition and complete retooling of its 3 million square feet over 12 months has been called the economic development deal of 2011 by one national

publication. When Explorer production ceased, the LAP had a "near-death experience," Savona said, but Ford, the UAW and elected officials at the city and state level came together to keep it open and growing. When the first 2013 Ford Escape (*pictured at left*) rolls off the line by April the hourly workforce will have grown from 1,100 to 4,000 in three shifts and salaried workers will have tripled to 200. LAP creates an estimated ten outside jobs for every manufacturing job at the plant. A seating supplier alone will add 450 more jobs.

The technologically sophisticated plant has pervious paving that allows rainwater to soak through parking lots instead of requiring massive retention basins. A new "wet-on-wet-on-wet" painting process will eliminate energy-hungry oven drying steps. He said

its computerized systems and training bring the plant "from *Pong* to X-Box 360," drawing nation-wide visitors. The assembly line raises or lowers each car to a comfortable level for each worker's task. Savona's pride in these improvements was evident when he shared that his father worked 28 years on Ford's Wayne, MI line when heavy air tools and heavy bending were the norm . - *Lelan Woodmansee*
