Susan Williams has served as President of the Indiana Sports Corporation since March, 2005. Prior to her appointment, Williams was a long time ISC board of directors member serving in numerous volunteer roles, including the board vice chair of Administration and Finance and co-chair of the 2005 NCAA Women's Final Four

A community based not-for-profit organization, the mission of the ISC is to promote Indiana as a place to live, work and visit through sports and sporting events that bring national and international attention to the area.

During her tenure at the helm of the ISC, Indianapolis was awarded a five year commitment to host the Big Ten Men's and Women's Tournaments in 2006, the 2008 Olympic Diving Trials, 2012 Super Bowl, 2015 Men's Final Four, 2016 Women's Final Four. Very recently, the ISC was awarded the inaugural Big Ten Conference Football Championship, which will reside in Indianapolis for at least the next five years.

Prior to ISC, Williams served as Executive Director of the Indiana State Office Building Commission, where she oversaw the design and construction of the NCAA headquarters and Hall of Champions, the Indiana State Museum, and other projects throughout the State of Indiana. She served 13 years on the Indianapolis-Marion County City-County Council. Her numerous recognition for civic leadership includes the state's highest honor, the Sagamore of the Wabash Award

Williams serves on the boards of the Indianapolis Arts Council, the

Massachusetts Avenue Community Development Corporation, the Indianapolis Convention and Visitor's Association, the Indiana State Museum, the Board of Trustees of Franklin College and is a mayoral appointment to the Indianapolis Historic Preservation Commission.

She received her undergraduate degree from Franklin College and earned a master's degree from Indiana University.

President Stet introduced recipients of Rotary service awards ranging from five to twenty five years of service. The Rotary Habitat for






