
A native of Montgomery, Alabama, Dr. Capilouto previously served as Provost of the University of Alabama at Birmingham (UAB) and Dean of the UAB School of Public Health — a period of remarkable growth and transformation at one of the leading academic and health sciences institutions in the South.

Since arriving at the University of Kentucky, Dr. Capilouto has focused intently on meeting met with faculty, staff and students in UK's academic and professional schools and traveling from Pikeville to Paducah meeting with alumni and friends, community and business leaders and state lawmakers. ville Cardinals. Ken provided an inspiring talk about how he took the Cardinals from a losing team to national champions in 6 years



He compared this to trying to cross the river in a canoe. Without a vision everyone gets in, pushes off, then realizes there are no oars and no way to get to their goal. The human mind has the capacity to remember and imagine the future. We can envision a future or a goal and a path to get there. The path involves change and change requires growth. The growth people experience achieving a goal lasts forever, the goal that they achieve is fleeting.

Ken also believes in identifying the gifts in individual people have and what each individual can contribute to achieving a goal and the growth that comes along with it. He referred to a book "Whale Done" that describes how Sea World trains killer whales to perform stunts. The basis is to "Love, Hug and Feed" or use rewards to change behavior.
