










Club Meeting - November 17, 2011

We met in the Galt House's "Waterford Room" on November 17, 2011. Bill Brantley gave the invocation and Bob Slider led us in saying the Pledge and singing "Shine On, Harvest Moon" accompanied on the piano by Charlie Castner. Our seven guests were introduced and welcomed. We had no visiting Rotarians. Cyndi Caudill recognized four Rotarians at the Birthday Table, to whom we sang "Happy Birthday to You." President Stet Stetten announced these Service Award Anniversaries: Charles Mattingly (15 years), Gail Becker (20 years), Christine Johnson (20 years), and Doug Yates (30 years); and these Rotarians in the news received "shout outs": Roland Blahnik, Charles Smith, David Heintzman, and Tom Williams. President Stet Stetten expressed thanks to our own Patricia Hart, who has agreed to serve as our interim Executive Director.



Our next meeting, hosted by the Kiwanis Club, is on Wednesday, November 23 (Galt House East, Grand Ballroom B and C). Our Holiday Party is on Friday evening, December 9, at the Brown Hotel's "Crystal Ballroom." President Stet Stetten next called on Allan Parnell who conducted our second ever Paul Harris Auction. Bringing to bear his craft, cunning, and guile, Allan swiftly auctioned off three Paul Harris Fellowships at full sticker price. Congratulations to the three new Fellows, and special thanks to Allan!

Wayne Perkey introduced AI Cross, a distinguished political reporter and commentator, who now heads the University of Kentucky's Institute for Rural Journalism and Community Issues. In his spare time, Cross writes political columns for the *Courier-Journal* and comments on KET's election night coverage. What is "rural journalism" now? It is disseminating the basic health information sorely needed in smaller communities. It also is supporting community newspapers stressed by the internet's ubiquity. Shifting to the recent gubernatorial race, which he had hoped to be "one for the ages," Cross expressed his disappointment that the principal candidates gave the public so little of themselves. It was incumbency and fundraising on one side, and rank unpopularity on the other, he said. He addressed other subjects including Sen. Mitch McConnell and state politics, and the possible effects of Everyman's access to redistricting software on the 'net'. Cross then took questions on wealth from the insider trading of elected officials, local option right-to-work, child farm labor, tax reform's future, infrastructure spending, and casino gambling on the ballot.
