ROTARY CLUB OF LOUISVILLE WAYS TO GIVE:

LOUISVILLE ROTARY PROMISE SCHOLARSHIP: Our Club is celebrating its 100th Anniversary in July 2012 with the creation of the Louisville Rotary Promise Scholarship. We share the vision of the Greater Louisville Project and 55,000 Degrees with Jefferson Community & Technical College and Jefferson County Public Schools to double the number of bachelor's degrees and increase the attainment of associate degrees, diplomas and certificates by 2020. Achieving these goals will move the community into the top tier among peer cities and enhance the quality of life for all.

ROTARY FUND OF LOUISVILLE, INC.: Similarly, the Rotary Club of Louisville has its own charitable, humanitarian fund, the Rotary Fund of Louisville, endowed through local contributors. Thousands of dollars in grants have been awarded annually to a wide range of non-profit, charitable endeavors in the Greater Louisville community and within the Club's geographic District.

THE 1912 SOCIETY: While the Rotary Fund of Louisville has a rich history of receiving gifts and bequests to its Foundation (Rotary Fund of Louisville), 2006-2007 President R. Wood Northup initiated a multi-phased endowment building effort during his leadership year. In January of 2007 Past President Woody put into place three phases of the Rotary Club of Louisville Endowment Building Project, The 1912 Society. Phase I - All living past presidents were asked to give \$10,000 or more. This level is the "Charter Member of the 1912 Society." Phase II - "Founding Members" were asked to contribute \$5,000 or more. Phase III - \$1,000 - \$4,999 "1912 Society Member."


ROTARY INTERNATIONAL WAYS TO GIVE:
