Have you noticed the colored sticker on your badge?


- 1. The bucket may see you first. Do not procrastinate. (Her list includes spending the night at 21C and going to the Derby.)

- 10. Start a list. Life is short, but use your time to do a lot of the things you want to do. Keep a "Bucket List" state of mind.


