

Club Meeting - February 16, 2012

He then introduced our two guest musicians, Naomi Oliphant and Daniel Weeks. We had one visiting Rotarian. Members recognized thirteen special guests. Joe Ferguson introduced four Rotary birthday celebrants.

President Stet recognized five members with Service Award Anniversaries. Our next week's meeting and speaker were announced as well as a location change for our meeting on March 8th, to now take place at Walnut Street Baptist Church. Three new members were then introduced.

The meeting was turned over to Henry Heuser, Jr. to introduce our guest speaker, Chuck Denny. Henry reminded us that Mr. Denny was recognized as one of his Heroes last year. Louisville is our speaker's hometown. He graduated from Seneca High School and then went on to receive one of his degrees

from the University of Louisville. Mr. Denny and his wife have a son, daughter-in-law and three grandchildren.

Mr. Denny is the Regional President for the Kentucky, Tennessee and Southern Indiana Markets for PNC. PNC is the area's largest bank and the fifth largest in the country. Mr. Denny began his presentation by recognizing many Louisville leaders who were in the audience. Mr. Denny says banking is a business of trust so PNC requires ethics certification every year.
