Lloyd served eight years as the trainer for the Colonels, many years as a high school basketball coach and continues as leader of the nationally known "King of the Bluegrass" tournament.

President Maynard 'Stet' L. Stetten, M.D. and Guest Speaker, Dr. John Hale

The meeting was turned over to Lynn Ogden who introduced our guest speaker, Dr. John Hale. Hale is a professor at the University of Louisville, and since 1989 he has been Director of Liberal Studies. Dr. Hale has degrees from Yale and Cambridge Universities.

Dr. Hale educated us on the Art of Public Speaking, using as examples twelve of the best speakers of all time. From this we learned that to be a good public speaker we must practice (Demosthenes of Athens), connect with the audience by opening up (Queen Elizabeth 1 of England to her Army), build a logical case (Susan B. Anthony), deliver a story (Dr. Marie Curie), learn to change minds and hearts (Mark Antony), and use our voices and bodies to reinforce meaning and then finish strongly (Patrick Henry of Virginia). It is also essential to paint pictures in words (Tecumseh of the Shawnee), use the power of three (Paul of Tarsus), share our vision so as to inspire (Martin Luther King), focus on the audience (Mahatma Ghandi), find our humorous voice, if appropriate to the topic (Will Rogers), and call for positive action at the conclusion of a speech (Abraham Lincoln). Abraham Lincoln proved that a speech can be short, yet still be one of the greatest speeches ever delivered. - Leo G. Smith
