Chief Conrad began his career as a patrol officer and worked his way through the ranks before being named Assistant Police Chief. Career highlights include managing the merger of the Louisville Division of Police and the Jefferson County Police Department, as well as heading the Kentucky Derby Festival. Chief Conrad received a Bachelor of Science degree in Police Administration and a Master of Science degree in Community Development, both from the University of Louisville. He attended and successfully completed the Southern Police Institute's Administrative Officers Course and the FBI's National Academy.

Chief Conrad worked closely with staff, residents and business leaders to make Glendale a safer community. Significant accomplishments include improved community outreach and enhanced commitment to crime prevention and control. He successfully planned for and managed a number of high profile sporting events including the Fiesta Bowl and the Bowl Championship Series National Championship game and was the lead police agency responsible for the planning and security during Super Bowl 42.

Tony's wife, Nancy Newberry, and the group of Kosair Charities guests and dignitaries looked on as we stood and applauded in thanks and appreciation for their generous donations.

Glen Stuckel introduced guest speaker, Mark Simendinger, General Manager of Kentucky Speedway, Kentucky's newest, important sports enterprise. Mark first confessed that he no longer hoped for a standing ovation, as the price tag was too high, then launched into an informative chat about Kentucky's entry into the world of VROOOOM! -- NASCAR, Sprint Cup racing, celebrity drivers, teams, and their backers. Establishing a new NASCAR racetrack is a zero-sum competition. To be viable, a new track must take an event away from another track. Fan interest in Speedway is intense. Only the Daytona 500 beat Speedway's Kentucky debut. Last year's Quaker State 400 fan response utterly overwhelmed Speedway's capacity. The Speedway has responded with an additional 175 acres of parking, a pedestrian tunnel, and new traffic lanes. This time, the Speedway will be prepared for its success.
