




Next Meeting: Thursday, April 23, 2015

The Kentucky gubernatorial election will take place on November 3, 2015, to elect the Governor of Kentucky. The race is heating up, with the primary election only a month away on May 19. For the first time in Club history, on April 23 we will host a Gubernatorial Primary panel discussion with the four Republican candidates. April 16, 2015 Rotary Meeting

The meeting was called to order by President Kevin Wardell, followed by the invocation from Tom Williams and the Pledge of Allegiance and 4-Way Test by Tom Bohnert. Glenn Price introduced the song, 'New York New York' performed by the talented Music Committee. President Kevin introduced Mike Brumleve, Metro Louisville Speech Contest Coordinator, who provided contest guidelines/rules before introducing Contestants 'A' and 'B'.

Contestant A shared about her involvement with a program entitled the 'Kentucky United Nations Assembly' where young people from all over the state join together each year for a mock U.N. assembly, representing and debating proposals as ambassadors of various countries. She learned that the two most common prevalent issues are starvation and contaminated water. During her trip to India last year, she observed extreme poverty and she decided that she wanted to make a difference. Soon thereafter, she discovered 'Helping Hands', an organization that takes children in off the streets of India. She ended her speech by expressing her desire to be among the 34,000+ Rotary Clubs throughout the world to let her light shine and help make a difference.

Contestant B began his speech listing current world issues and the fact that media only shares the bad news. He said it seems as if there are only bad, self-centered people; however, he shared that there are many good people doing amazing things for their communities. He shared about his involvement with the 'Do Something Club' (entirely self-organized by 30 students of his school) that raises funds to give back to their community and to financially help different countries in need. The students' only incentive is to help others. He shared how we can all take steps to make our community a better place and, after this has been done, we will see our world become a better place. He said, *"The only thing standing between you and lighting up the world is yourself!"* After listing numerous Rotary projects and achievements, worldwide and locally, he stated that Rotary acts as a beacon of light and that no act is too small. He stated that each one of us can make a difference, and quoted Martin Luther King Jr. who said: *"Darkness cannot drive out darkness, only light can do that."* Contestant B ended with a challenge: *"Let us all be the light that drives out the darkness of this world."* Both contestants delivered impressive speeches. It would be a tough decision for the judges!

Guests were welcomed and introduced. Sean Letwat introduced the birthday celebrants. Among those present celebrating 92 years of age was Bussy Short, a Rotarian for 46 years! Also celebrating 86 years was Bill Kelly Jr, and this is Bill's 50th year in Rotary! Special congrats, thanks and appreciation to Bussy and Bill for their longtime Rotary service!! President Kevin announced the April 23 meeting when we will host a panel of four Republican candidates running for Governor of Kentucky. President Elect Greg Braun encouraged everyone to attend the fundraiser for the Club's foundation on May 12. Second Vice President Julie Schmidt introduced new members, Marianne Butler (LG&E Community Initiatives Manager) and Mark Grundy (Partner at Bingham Greenebaum Doll LLP). President Kevin presented new Paul Harris Fellow Dan Mason with his new pin, thanking him for his generous support to TRF (The Rotary Foundation). He also presented new PHF pins with added gemstones (representing multiple donations) to President Elect Nominee Alice Bridges and District Governor Elect Michael Kull. Mike Brumleve announced the winner of the Regional Speech Contest, presenting the first-place \$500 prize to Gatlin Newhouse, North Oldham H.S. Senior, who plans to attend Reed College in Portland, Oregon to study computer science. Receiving the second-place \$300 prize was Niki Rajendran, a Franklin County H.S. Freshman, and she plans to be either a doctor or a lawyer. Ken Grossman lost the Pot O' Gold, so the total has now risen to \$591.
