April 18, 2013 Rotary Meeting

Robin Jennings drew from the 23rd Psalm in his invocation, and Raj Manwani led the Pledge and singing, many distinguished guests were welcomed, and Bill Dunn toasted our birth-



day celebrants. President Stuart thanked Rotarians who helped Louisville Public Media raise \$501,206. Greg Braun (pictured at left), decked out for the occasion, gave us a bird's eye view of the spectacular May 17 dinner and auction at the Parklands at Floyd's Fork. Rotarians will be flocking to the event, which is limited to the first 300, so don't be last in the pecking order!

Last year we celebrated Louisville Rotary's Centennial, with a \$1 million endowment so that any student who graduates from Western High School with a 2.5 GPA, 90% attend-



ance and a clean disciplinary record is guaranteed last-dollar scholarship for Jefferson Community and Technical

College. Mitch Rue highlighted many extra ways we have provided mentoring, leadership and career training. We hope these efforts are among the reasons we've already seen a "nice up tick" in performance at Western between the first and second trimesters. Now we're almost halfway to the \$4 million goal, and President Stuart presented a \$500,000 commemorative "check" to Rotarian and JCTCS President Tony Newberry (pictured at left).

Franklin Jelsma introduced our Rotarian speaker, Jefferson County Public Schools Supt. Dr. Donna Hargens, who recalled she last spoke to Rotary just two months into her tenure. At that time only 18 of 41 schools were performing to state standards and JCPS ranked better than only 9% of districts state-wide. She launched aggressive efforts that led to *Vision 2015*, a plan she distributed, with 36 measurable strategies.

Early results show JCPS now ranks at the 23rd percentile (up from 9th) among districts, with a graduation rate at 69% and college readiness up by 13%, with priority schools showing the greatest progress. She highlighted 5-Star schools, offering hands-on career-specific elective training in addition to core curriculum, "that makes learning relevant and college achievable for all." Dr. Hargens said JCPS has been nominated for national accreditation for its community partnerships, one of the most visible being the Rotary Promise Scholarships. "Some clubs donate a bench for a community park," she said, "This Rotary Club invests in students." Dr. Hargens announced that the second Rotary Promise Scholarship school will be Iroquois High School, and she introduced Principal Chris Perkins, our newest partner. — Lelan Woodmansee




