John Asher, Vice President of Racing Communications at Churchill Downs Race Track ("CDRT"), has worked in the Thoroughbred racing industry as an award-winning journalist and publicist for more than 30 years. He joined Churchill Downs, home of the world famous Kentucky Derby and the flagship operation of Churchill Downs Incorporated ("CDI"), in January 1997 and has served in his current position since March 1999.

As a radio journalist at WHAS-AM and WAVE-AM in Louisville, Asher earned five Eclipse Awards for "Outstanding National Radio Coverage of Thoroughbred Racing." Other horse industry honors include the Kentucky Thorough-

bred Owners' Warner L. Jones Jr. Horseman of the Year award in 2006; the Charles W. Engelhard Award, the Dean Eagle Award, and a media award from the Kentucky Horsemen's Benevolent & Protective Association. A recipient of numerous national awards, John was honored seven times by the Associated Press as Kentucky radio's "Best Reporter" in large market radio.

Asher is a 2010 graduate of the LLC's Leadership Louisville program, and is currently a member of its 2012 Bingham Fellows class. A native of Leitchfield, Kentucky, John is a Western Kentucky University graduate. A former president of the WKU National Alumni Board of Directors, Asher was honored in 2008 with a "Summit Award" for volunteer efforts on behalf of the university. He serves on the board of trustees of WLKY-32's "Spirit of Louisville Foundation," which oversees the annual Bell Awards for community service, and serves on the boards of GuardiaCare Services and Simmons College of Kentucky. John lives in Louisville with his wife, Dee, and they have three daughters.

April 25, 2013 Rotary Meeting

Rotary delivered a great package on April 25. Ken Reutlinger gave the invocation and Keith Knapp, Charlie Castner and crew led the Pledge and singing. President Stuart welcomed visiting Rotarians, including friends from the LaGrange Club, and many guests. Stuart also encouraged Paul Harris Fellows to attend the big May 17 Dinner/Auction, when a big class of new Paul Harris Fellows will be inducted. Bill Dunn hosted birthday celebrants, and Lukas Dwelly tantalized us with details of the May 18 Family Fun Picnic at the Parklands at Floyd's Fork.

Mary Michael Corbett introduced speaker Mitch Nichols, President of UPS Airlines. She noted that Nichols created the electronic gizmo you sign when the UPS driver brings you a package. Now he is responsible for one of the world's largest airlines, Louisville's Worldport sorting facility and for the safe, on-time arrival of 9,100 flight segments per

Nichols cited UPS' three-decade mutually beneficial relationship with Louisville that includes being the largest contributor to the United Way, and a sponsor of Thunder over Louisville. Having just celebrated the 25th anniversary of UPS Airlines, he took pride in the environmentally friendly UPS Boeing 767 in the air show—a far cry from the bicycle messenger service that started in a Seattle saloon's basement in 1907. Even then, he said, the watchword was service, providing anything the customer needed.

He highlighted the transformation to strengthen UPS from bikes to motorcycles, then air package delivery on the West coast in 1929, to 50-state coverage in the mid-1970s to a global presence in the 1980s, now covering 200 countries and territories with a UPS plane in the air every second of the day.

Investing to grow, Louisville's \$2 billion Worldport sorting hub employs more than 20,000. Worldport processes 1.6 million packages a day, making Louisville International the tenth busiest cargo airport in the world. A plane is unloaded and the payload reloaded on new planes in 13 minutes. Nichols said 156 companies have come to Kentucky to use this capability, bringing 12,000 additional jobs and \$300 million local payroll. UPS creates value for clients by helping them serve their customers faster, better and cheaper. With 99% of the world's population outside the U.S., he encourages businesses to think globally. "Louisville has talent and goods to export, and we can help you." Lelan Woodmansee


