Christen Boone is the President & CEO of the Fund for the Arts in Louisville, KY, one of our country's oldest and most successful united arts funds. Each year, the Fund for the Arts raises more than \$8,000,000 from over 20,000 donors and

supports 25 cultural partners and programs throughout the region. She is deeply committed to helping build a stronger and more vibrant Louisville. Christen has continuously worked as a community connector, social entrepreneur and a sought-after consultant in nonprofit development and strategic philanthropy. Before joining the Fund for the Arts, Boone served in leadership roles for some of the country's most treasured cultural institutions and has raised nearly \$250 million for regional nonprofit organizations including Actors Theatre of Louisville, the High Museum of Art in Atlanta, and Cincinnati's Fine Arts Fund. As a leader on another local project, she raised more than \$120 million to build The Parklands of Floyds Fork, one of the nation's largest new urban parks. Stretching 4,000 acres, The Parklands is the size of eight Central Parks and is lauded as one of the 21st century's great legacy projects.

ROTARY SERVICE PROJECTS SUMMARY

This year, our Club sponsored 26 service projects and approved 23 of them with \$95,664 in total funding. Everything from providing scholarships to building water supply systems & solar arrays. Most of our projects are local and are focused on improving the quality of life for our homeless, foster reading for our preschoolers and supporting non-profit organizations. Also, several are international projects; installing micro-toilets in Ghana, sending medical supplies to Haiti and teaming up with the Lexington Rotary Club to provide solar systems to schools in India.

These are just a few examples of our Club's involvement along with dedicated members who share a passion for both community service and fellowship. We have done a lot over these past several months, but we still have a long way to go. We want to thank our members for all the hard work the Club has done in the past and will do tomorrow.
