Kentucky's historic distilleries produce 95 percent of the world's Bourbon, a rich heritage that dates back more than 200 years. Today, Bourbon is "America's Official Native Spirit," a leading export and a popular symbol of Kentucky craftsmanship and tradition. Gregory joined the KDA in 2008 after seven years as Governmental Affairs Manager at East Kentucky Power Cooperative. He previously served as Vice President of Public Affairs for Preston-Osborne, a prominent Lexington public relations, marketing and research firm.

A graduate of the University of Kentucky, Gregory began his career as an award-winning journalist for the Lexington Herald-Leader. He also served as a reporter and editor at the Honolulu Advertiser, and has been nominated twice for the Pulitzer Prize. Gregory is a native of Henderson, Ky.
