





July 31, 2014 Rotary Meeting

Rotarians and their guests met on Thursday, July 31, 2014 at The Galt House in the Archibald Room, with Club President Kevin Wardell presiding. The invocation was provided by René Brown, and the pledge was led by Michael Shackelford.

Kristin Willard introduced birthday honorees at the birthday table, and members introduced their guests. President Kevin reminded members that the deadline is August 7 for payments to confirm reservations for the October 14 Dinner Cruise on the Belle of Cincinnati. The Executives Club is joining us for this cruise, and all guests are welcome. He also reminded us that August 7 is the deadline for reservations for the October 16 'Rotary Meeting on the River Queen'. ALL Rotarians must make reservations to attend. **CLICK HERE** for link.

Susan Smith, the New Member Orientation Committee Chair, provided details about joining the Rotary Club of Louisville. She announced that, in addition to the 11:15 AM first and

third Thursday sessions in the Rotary office for prospective members, beginning August 7 prospective members will be invited to join a table at the back of the meeting room for a 'What is Rotary?' session after the Rotary meeting ends. These sessions will provide more convenient options for prospective members.

Mike Fallot announced the next Repair Affair volunteer opportunity on September 20 (9a—3p). Rotarians are welcome to join a UPS volunteer team to help construct a handicapped ramp at a residence. No special skills are required. Dick Brien, Service Projects Committee Chair, then announced mentor opportunities to help high school students become eligible for Rotary Promise Scholarships (improve their grades, attendance and staying out of trouble). Dick shared how Rotarian mentors have already made a positive impact, and both Western and Iroquois High Schools have requested that our RPS mentor program be doubled. Dr. Bob Hilgers then presented the first of several 'health talks', on the topic of *Adult Immunizations*. He emphasized the importance of vaccinations as the best possible protection against vaccine preventable diseases, and that all adults should be aware and keep up with recommended immunizations. He stressed that they are an important part of staying healthy.

Ken Middleton introduced the speaker, Rotarian Kevin Connelly, founding director of the Center for Nonprofit Excellence. Kevin's presentation provided an in-depth review of the nonprofit sector in the Louisville community, the challenges it faces as well as the opportunities. He began his presentation with some history dating back to 1601 when Queen Elizabeth signed the Statute of Charitable Uses that allowed dollars to be used for certain purposes without taxation or subject to the crown's claim. To this day, this Statute is the foundation piece for our IRS legislation allowing for the governance and use of dollars exempted from taxation. Kevin highlighted several nonprofit organizations that are part of the Rotary Club of Louisville, and the meaningful impact they have in our community and region. His presentation included facts and data about how the Louisville nonprofit sector compares with other peer cities. He also emphasized the importance of leadership development and the training that CNPE offers. The meeting was adjourned after questions and the 4-Way Test recitation.
