

August 14, 2014 Rotary Meeting

Clint Scharff led us in the Boy Scouts' Wilderness Blessing. President-Elect Greg Braun led the *Pledge* and introduced singer/songwriter Tyrone Cotton, who strummed and sang.

Visiting Rotarians included President-Elect Emile, from Monrovia, Liberia. Karen Morrison introduced birthday celebrants and reminded us to sign up for Rotary's booth at Worldfest over Labor Day weekend. Tom Bohnert urged us to "go long" in Rotary Foundation Football. You can sign up and pick your favorite college and pro team online at THIS LINK. Speaking of football, President Kevin announced that next week's meeting will feature WDRB Sports Journalists, Rick Bozich and Eric Crawford.

Gary Ulmer introduced guest speaker Vic Staffieri, President and CEO of Louisville Gas & Electric / Kentucky Utilities. LG&E is a complex and rapidly changing

enterprise that focuses on keeping low-cost energy reliably available to its 1.3 million customers. "I've never had anybody call me and say their electricity was on," he quipped, but he made it clear that he and his 3,300 employees take their customers and communities to heart.

He said LG&E/KU spent \$1.45 billion in 2013 on improvements, which was 40 percent more than any previous year, and 60 percent of which was to comply with new federal environmental regulations. From now through 2018, the company will spend an additional \$6 billion, hiring 3,200 skilled construction workers for projects here and around our state.

Staffieri said sulfur dioxide emissions have dropped 88 percent since 1997. Along with environmental regulations have come other adjustments, for federal homeland security requirements and information system safeguards. Nevertheless, LG&E rates remain among the region's — and nation's — lowest. New coal regulations will diminish this advantage. He pointed out that 800 megawatts of coal-fired generating capacity will be retired next year when the \$560 million Cane Run Number 7 goes on line. By 2016 LG&E's electricity will come 64% from coal, 35% from natural gas and one percent from renewable solar now being tested.

In 20 years Staffieri sees increasing reliance on natural gas versus coal. "We can get to the current regulations, but the technology hasn't caught up to the new federal standards," he said. "I wouldn't want (to make that investment in coal plants) without a sense that it's a commercially viable technology." Lelan Woodmansee


