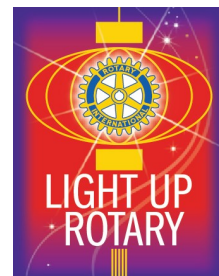

Marc Murphy's political cartoons are published five times weekly by the Louisville Courier-Journal, and distributed nationally by the Gannet Company. His work has been called "insightful" and "emotionally charged". Also, it has been blamed for "the downfall of Western Civilization".

By day, and some nights, Marc is a partner in the law firm Stites & Harbison, PLLC, where he chairs the White Collar and Government Litigation practice group. He graduated Phi Beta Kappa from the University of Notre Dame during an admittedly down year for the school, academically, and the University of Louisville School of Law. He served in Germany and Central America as an Army prosecutor, and was appointed Jefferson County's Commonwealth's Attorney in 1995.

He was raised in Ashland, Kentucky. His father was a radio and television personality who met his mother while she played the accordion on the Saturday Night Jamboree in Huntington, West Virginia. That pretty much explains everything.

August 21, 2014 Rotary Meeting

Sydney Goetz gave the invocation and Glenn Price introduced guest performers, blues singer Tyrone Cotton and sax man Tim Waylend. President Kevin welcomed visiting Rotarians and guests, and Lukas Dwelly toasted our birthday celebrants. Kevin reminded us we MUST PRE-REGISTER to attend the October 16 Rotary meeting on the River Queen. Check your email for the link. Prez-Elect Greg Braun pointed out the "What Is Rotary?" table at the back of the room, where we can bring prospective members for a 10-minute Rotary overview at the close of each week's meeting.

Nima Kulkarni reminded us to sign up for Rotary's booth at Worldfest over Labor Day weekend to share Rotary's good work with 100,000 visitors and prospective members. Dr. Bob Hilgers gave the latest in our periodic health updates, with a review of Centers for Disease Control recommendations for adult vaccinations by age and by medical condition.

President Kevin reminded us to sign up for Rotary Foundation Football, and Bill Lamb presented our speakers, WDRB Sports Journalists, Rick Bozich and Eric Crawford. During their opening banter Eric quipped, "*This may be the only debate these people see this year.*" At this time last year, Rick reminded us that he picked U of L's football record to be 11-1, while Eric's prediction was 12-0. Crawford protested, "*As in the Derby, sometimes it's not the pick that's wrong, but the wrong horse wins.*"

This year Crawford predicts Louisville to go 9-3; Bozich, 8-4. Debating the most important game of the season, Eric picked Florida State, due to the Seminoles' desire to repeat national championships in the first year of the bowl playoffs. Bozich countered that the Cards' opener against Miami, after beating the Hurricanes 36-9 in the Russell Athletic Bowl, will have Miami looking for revenge. Louisville is favored in Vegas by only 3.5 points. Rick said this game, the only TV game in the country that night, sets the tone for Louisville's first season in the ACC.

Bozich predicted Kentucky to have a 4-8 football season but to be competitive against Louisville late in the season. Kentucky's team will have younger players and the advantage of a bye week prior to the game, while Louisville will be coming off a bout with Notre Dame in South Bend.

The sportscasters predicted 2014-15 to be "a phenomenal year for college basketball."
