### Presentation Title: "The Navy the Nation Needs"

It has been since 1794 when Congress authorized the construction of six frigates because it was deemed necessary for a naval force be provided for protection. While everything else has changed during the past two centuries...ships, aircraft, people, even the world...your Navy's enduring mission has remained: to deliver combat-ready naval forces to win conflicts and wars while maintaining security and deterrence through a sustained forward presence.

Preserving America's strategic interests overseas is another important part of our Navy's mission. America's Navy also plays a large part in preserving trade around the world. More than 40 million U.S. jobs - 26 percent - are directly or indirectly tied to global trade. The free flow of goods over the world's oceans is a national security issue. And the
