In his presentation, Dick will demonstrate how to build friendships as well as how to make current relationships even better. The continuum for growing our "people skills" starts with changing ourselves a little bit. Wayne B. Tuckson, President of the Greater Louisville Medical Society, greeted Rotarians by boldly stating the title of his presentation, "Marcus Welby, M.D. Is Dead." Dr. Tuckson explained in detail that the patient-centered medical practice, and the doctor-patient relationship have been almost completely replaced by business-focused practice and the doctor-business-patient relationship. Whereas 75% of medical practices were still physician-owned in 2002, it's about 50% now, with hospitals owning about 50%. Approximately 90% of new doctors today will be hospital employed, reported Dr. Tuckson. He cited reasons for physicians' exodus from private practice as business expense, practice expense, relationships with health insurers, malpractice costs and call coverage, all of which increase along with a general increase of business-focused attention more to costs and liability than the patient and quality of care. Despite the transition to increasingly more administration in medicine, would Dr. Tuckson recommend it to students considering a medical profession? Speaking personally, "because I love it," and emphasizing that because he does still love the patient relationship and providing care, he said "yes."


