### **MEETING PREVIEW - JANUARY 5, 2017**

**DAVID ADKISSON** - On January 5th, the President of the Kentucky Chamber of Commerce will be reporting on changes the Chamber and state government expects see in the coming year after the Republican party won majorities in both the state Senate and House of Representatives earlier this fall. He hopes that, in the coming year, Kentucky businesses will benefit from economy-growing and job-creating policies that will likely come from Frankfort lawmakers.
