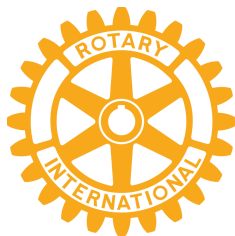

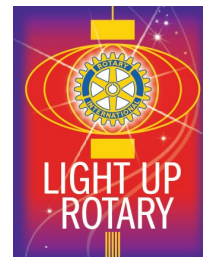

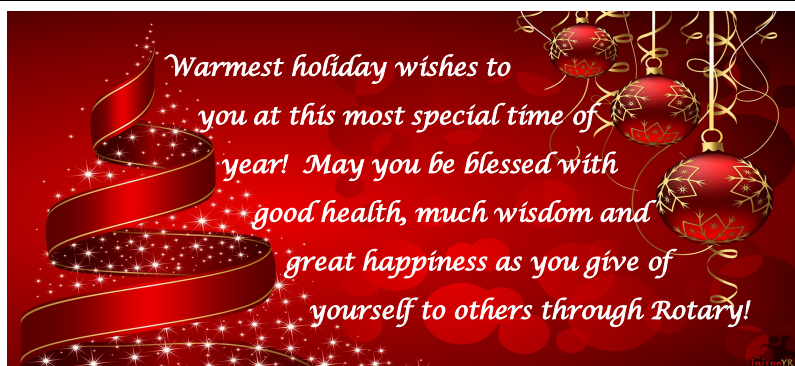

A native of Havertown, Pennsylvania, Bob is a graduate of Trinity College, Hartford, where he earned a BS in Pre-Medicine in 1963. He served as a Lieutenant in the U.S. Navy from 1965-1968. In 1970, Bob earned an MBA from the Colgate Darden Graduate School of Business Administration at the University of Virginia.

Bob started his investment career in 1969 with a summer job at Chase Manhattan Bank as an equity securities analyst. In 1970, he moved to Atlanta to join First National Bank of Atlanta, where he was an analyst/portfolio manager for seven years. In 1977, he joined Thorndike, Doran, Paine & Lewis, an investment counseling firm, as a portfolio manager. Bob joined Todd in 1980 as a member of the equity management team. He and Bos Todd initiated the large cap equity investment strategy that Todd Asset Management employs today for several of its portfolios. Bob became President in September 1996, and Chairman in January 2006. Bob is a member of the Board of Directors of Wellspring and the Community Foundation of Louisville. A Rotarian with the Rotary Club of Louisville for 15 years, Bob is also a Sustaining Member and a Paul Harris Fellow.

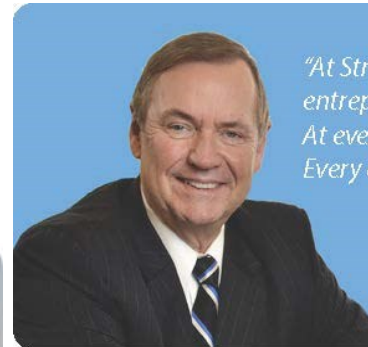

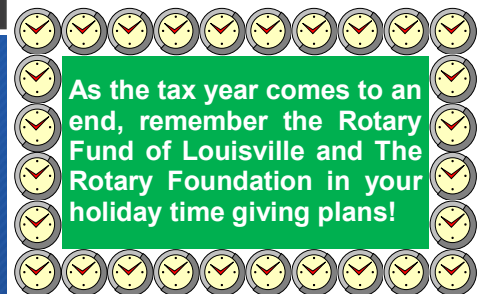
