

Maker's Mark Chairman Emeritus Bill Samuels, Jr. (photo at left) has been called a maverick, a giant in the distillery business, a marketing genius, a visionary, and the best friend the Kentucky Bourbon industry ever had. Be he prefers another label: "Eyewitness". A rocket scientist, law school graduate, and bourbon industry extraordinaire, Bill Samuels has had a remarkable life and career. Anything of any significance that happened in the past two or three generations of distilling, Bill not only lived through it, but chances are he was actually there. As Bill transitioned to Chairman Emeritus at Maker's Mark, he accomplished another remarkable achievement in the distilling craft when he introduced a new expression in whisky called Maker's 46.



Mike Veach (photo at right) served as North American Archivist for United Distillers Glenmore from 1992-1996. Mike was hired as a Special Collections Assistant at the Filson Historical Society and specializes in Kentucky's distilling history. He has served as a historical consultant for many distilleries. In 2006 Mike was honored to become a member of the Kentucky Bourbon Hall of Fame.

Mike will give a historical background of the economic impact of prohibition in Kentucky and how this contributed to the Great Depression of 1929. Bill will put into context the incredible growth our Kentucky signature industry is experiencing and has been experiencing through our Country's economic downtown. Merrily Orsini then made an announcement about the forthcoming Lifetime Service Award. Greg Braun introduced a new member, Jim Murphy.


Since today's program is Nomination Day, Mike Kull presented the first of two slates: The "COE-sair Kids" slate. Isn't that neat since we know where


