February 14, 2013 Rotary Meeting

Tracy Holladay provided the invocation today. President Stuart led a moment of silence for longtime Rotarian Bremer Ehrler who passed away. In honor of Valentine's Day, we sang "Let Me Call You Sweetheart" to all the women. Randy Coe announced a Kosair Charities matching grant challenge of \$10,000 — \$50,000 to the Club. Randy tongue in cheek asked if anyone wanted to provide the matching total today. Ann

Michelle Griffin then introduced today's speaker Bruce Broussard, President and CEO of Humana, Inc. Bruce said he joined Humana about a year ago to make a difference.

He believes healthcare in the US is broken and is not sustainable as it is too expensive. Ten thousand people a day are aging into Medicare coverage in the US; however, 80 percent of our population is either obese or overweight, which will present challenges to the healthcare system. Bruce believes the system does not focus on health care but sick care. His vision is for providers to simplify delivery of healthcare services to the consumer by empowering the consumer, by connecting directly to the consumer base, and by customizing services to the consumer. He used the example of Netflix providing entertainment direct to the consumers as opposed through a network.

His vision is for Humana to change its interaction with consumers from a transaction based model to a community with the consumer community model through their integrated "Halo of Health". Humana would implement this through evolving the structure of health by providing economic benefits for healthy choices, decreasing fragmentation of benefits, and engaging members to take responsibility for their own health.

Regarding the Healthcare Reform Act, Bruce thought it was good that coverage is now expanded, but many details of the law are not completely known or understood. He believes 2014 will be a bumpy road and the cost of insurance will certainly go up. Additional change is needed to evolve from a system where a good output is rewarded rather than just payment for a service given, and to reduce waste where about a third of Medicare dollars are now wasted.
