A cornerstone of Louisville's cultural landscape and a nationally and internationally recognized force in American Theatre, Actors Theatre of Louisville is celebrating its 49th season under a new Artistic Director, Les Waters. Originally hailing from England, Obie award-winning director Les Waters was appointed Artistic Director of Actors Theatre in January, 2012. With more than 30 years of experience in theatre, Waters has forged a formidable career and is recognized as one of the most important directors working in America today.

A champion to some of theatre's most important and prominent playwrights and a strong proponent of contemporary work and adaptations of classic material, his shows have garnered great critical acclaim, routinely ranking

among the year's best named by critics in *The New Yorker, New York Times, Time Out New York, Time Magazine,* and USA Today. In 2009, Waters made his Broadway debut with renowned playwright Sarah Ruhl's *In the Next Room (or the vibrator play)*. Prior to taking up the position at Actors Theatre, Mr. Waters spent eight years as Associate Artistic Director at Berkeley Repertory Theatre in California, and previously led the MFA directing program at University of California, San Diego.

His well researched talk on Alzheimers, Dementia, and Aging brought us "up to speed" with the very latest developments on treatment AND prevention of these problems. He cautioned us to AVOID: high fat diet, smoking, obesity, hypertension, heart disease, diabetes, and head injuries. Dietary inclusions should include Omega-3 (fish oil), B vitamins, and daily flossing.
