TOPIC: One Love Louisville - You Can Be the One to Make a Difference

Every 24 hours in America, 13 young people under the age of 25 are victims of homicide. And homicide is the leading cause of death for black males between the ages of 15 and 24, responsible for more deaths of black males in this age group than the nine other leading causes combined. Cities, and the mayors who lead them, have the power and the responsibility to help end this senseless loss of life

and Cities United is leading the way under the guidance of Anthony Smith, the organization's first executive officer. Before his appointment to this national post last October, he led the Office for Safe and Healthy Neighborhoods for Mayor Fischer and the city of Louisville. At the announcement of his position, Philadelphia Mayor Michael A. Nutter said: "Anthony's work has prepared him well to lead Cities United. His personal mission has always been to find opportunities to create better outcomes for African American men and boys, their families and the communities they call home." Mr. Smith will share how cities are taking the lead in creating positive outcomes for youth, drawing on his experience crafting Louisville's strategic plan to address violence.
