David J. Brown leads the National Trust's comprehensive preservation efforts, with four decades of experience in saving historic places and building thriving, livable communities. He oversees the Trust's National Treasure campaigns which help

protect some of the country's most significant and threatened historic places. David also guides the Trust's advocacy work, oversees support for local preservation leadership, promotes preservation's role in environmental sustainability through the Preservation Green Lab, and is leading the exploration and adaptation of new models of preservation at National Trust historic sites. From 1999-2003, David successfully led the organization's \$135 million Campaign for America's Historic Places. more here

### Member Spotlight



WILLIAM "BILL" J. ROTHWELL, PhD. - Dr. served as Vice President for Development and Alumni at the University of Louisville from April 1, 1989 until June 30, 2000. He was responsible for all aspects of fundraising and alumni relations for the University including the planning, coordination and implementation of a comprehensive capital campaign, corporate and foundation giving, deferred gifts, annual fund, college-based fundraising, gift acknowledgements and stewardship. His responsibilities also included maintaining a database of over 150,000 alumni donor friends and other constituents of the University. Under Rothwell's leadership, fundraising increased from roughly \$7 million in 1989 to almost \$60 million in 2000. The University's endowment grew from \$78 million to over \$513 million during that same time period. UofL had the fastest growing endowment of any college or university in the nation in 1997.
