A native of Kentucky, Keith served as a medic in the U.S. Coast Guard before moving back to Louisville 23 years ago to begin a career with the American Red Cross. He has worked in Disaster Planning and Response throughout his career. Keith has worked in management with the Red Cross for the last 17 years, accepting the role as the CEO for the Louisville Area Chapter and the Kentuckiana Region of the American Red Cross in 2009.

Disaster response on large scale disasters has been a cornerstone to a career that has led Keith and his family around the country. He has participated as part of the leadership team in many of the major disasters of the last two decades. These include Hurricane Katrina, the Sept 11 attack in New York, the Lexington Com-Air crash, Hurri-

cane Floyd, the KY-IN March 2012 tornadoes and, most recently, the Hurricane Sandy Relief in New York.

Keith's belief is that the best way to respond to any disaster is to prepare for it before it happens. Keith will share some of his observations and firsthand knowledge of disaster relief efforts, discuss disasters we anticipate for our community, and help individuals and businesses understand what we can do to prepare for a local disaster.

Keith and his wife of 28 years live in Louisville with their youngest child and have two older children away at school.

# January 3, 2013 Rotary Meeting

#### Welcome to Rotary 2013!

President Stuart called the meeting to order and Merrill Moter gave the Prayer of David as our invocation. Because of our esteemed guest speaker, Bob Slider and Charlie Castner led us all in the song "We're In the Money". Here's hoping that will be the case this new year. No fewer than 17 guests were introduced, another tribute to speaker Bos Todd.

In other business, Membership Committee Chair, Greg Braun, announced a January 23 membership party, 'Meet @ MEAT' being held at 5:30 at the Meat Bar. He encouraged Rotarians to attend and bring prospective members. Cliff Elgin, Entertainment Committee Chair, announced a February 13 Rotary Night Out. The RNO will begin at The Bristol for

dinner at 5:30 pm, and afterwards the "Million Dollar Quartet" at The Kentucky Center will begin at 7:30 pm. Rotarians and their guests will be invited to stay after the show for a private Q&A with members of the cast and crew.

After a retrospective introduction by Bob Bordogna of last year's forecast, Mr. Todd, Chairman Emeritus of Todd Asset Management, shared with us his economic view of the coming 12 months. "Dancing on the Edge of the Cliff" was an aptly named talk.

According to Bos, "The fiscal cliff odyssey produced no long run budget fix, leaves the door wide open for another debt ceiling fiasco in a matter of weeks, and installed a new "mini-cliff" for government spending in two months. But the deal, agreed to at the last moment, lessens the risk of the worst case scenario of a recession-inducing fiscal shock."

Some interesting highlights include: GDP will grow at two percent annually; interest rates will remain low until employment data shows a significant improvement; the Fed will continue to affect asset prices as long as unemployment remains high; and, Bos added, "Market timing seldom works, so stick to your plan." 
