Committed to growing jobs and creating a culture of innovation and entrepreneurship, Greg Fischer was elected Louisville's 50th mayor in 2010 and is now seeking a second term. Since taking office, Mayor Fischer has pursued three top goals: making Louisville a city of lifelong learning, a much healthier city, and an even more compassionate community. As a businessman and entrepreneur, he is also bringing innovation to city government to make it more efficient and accessible.

Mayor Fischer's accomplishments include: 1) Regaining the 42,000 jobs lost to the long recession, including creating 12,400 new jobs in 2013 alone; 2) Launching *full-speed-ahead* construction of the two Ohio River bridges while opening the Big Four Bridge, used by thousands of walkers, joggers and cyclists monthly; 3) Bringing innovation and efficiency to city

government by using data to increase performance through LouieStat, moving forward with the Louisville Water/MSD consolidation, and reaching a deal to bring \$27 million in efficiencies to city facilities with no upfront costs; and 4) Earning "International Compassionate City" recognition for Louisville in part by creating the Give A Day week of community service, which drew nearly 110,000 volunteers and acts of compassion in April, 2013. He was named a 2013 "Public Official of the Year" by *Governing Magazine*, the only U.S. mayor to earn the distinction.

Greg is an entrepreneur, businessman and philanthropist who started several businesses including SerVend International and Iceberg Ventures, a private investment firm. Greg graduated from Trinity High School and Vanderbilt University. He and his wife Alex have four children. We hope you will join us at Churchill Downs for what promises to be one of our best attended and exciting meetings of the year.

All aboard! For the first time in the history of our Club, the October 16, 2014 Rotary meeting will be held on the Ohio





January 9, 2014 Rotary Meeting

Our first Rotary meeting of 2014 was presided over by Past President Bos Todd. Dave Ramer provided the invocation and Alex Novak led the pledge of allegiance. Alex also led Rotarians in the song 'Side by Side', followed by the birthday table host, Carol Nord, who acknowledged the birthday celebrant, Stet Stetten.

Past President Bos announced that the next Rotary meeting will be on January 16 at Churchill Downs in the Triple Crown Room, and Mayor Greg Fischer will present his annual "State of the City" address.

Rick Harned introduced Margaret Fenton and explained how she was our Club's nominee and had been selected as 2014 Rotary Peace Fellow. This is a 'first' for our Club. Ms. Fenton (photo at left with Rick Harned) shared how she received a full scholarship from Rotary International to study and receive practical training at the University of Bradford in England for two years. She will study international relations, conflict resolution and development issues, supplemented by direct fieldwork.

Before introducing the main speaker, Bob Bordogna, Bos Todd mentioned several of his stock predictions made last year, reviewing how close (or off) his predictions had been and mentioned, *"Now you know why I'm turning this over to someone else."* He then introduced Bob Bordogna who im-

mediately congratulated Bos for having provided his annual stock prediction program with excellence to the Rotary Club for the past 44 years! Everyone rose to their feet to thank and congratulate Bos with a well-deserved standing ovation! Bob went on to present a very detailed, impressive report entitled "The Rocky Road to Economic Normalcy." He quoted John K. Galbraith who had said, *"The function of economic forecasting is to make astrology look respectable."* Bob noted that, as 2014 opens, we have more clarity about fiscal and monetary policies than we have had for many years. He said that there was a positive effect as this clarity became better known during the last 45 days of 2013 when various agreements and appointments were made. Bob gave a review of the market and ended with his stock predictions, followed by a long list of disclaimer statements. It was clearly evident why this is a popular annual meeting, and we are grateful to Bob for agreeing to carry on the tradition. *Debe Skidmore*


