

The second meeting of 2015 of the Rotary Club of Louisville began when President Kevin Wardell rang the bell at 12:10. He asked that we join him for a Moment of Silence for Rotarian CHARLES HERD, who passed away on January 9. Charlie was 93 and belonged to our club for almost 48 years. He was true champion of Louisville, and served as CEO of the Louisville Chamber of Commerce (now known as GLI) for 18 years. Charlie helped lead planning and development for the Belvedere, Heritage Festival weekends, I-265/Gene Snyder Parkway and Leadership Louisville. After retiring, he was appointed to the Sr. Executive Service Corps of the U.S. Chamber. The visitation and funeral were held earlier this week. Donations can either be made to Westport Road Church of Christ, the Leadership Louisville Scholarship Fund or the Charles F. Herd Scholarship Fund c/o Greater Louisville, Inc.

Merrill Moter provided the invocation, and Board Member Tom Bohnert led the pledge and Rotary 4–Way Test. President Kevin introduced the Mike

John Jennings promoted the Wine Tasting Event on Jan 29 from 6:00-7:30 at the Filson historical Society.

President Kevin called for Rotarians who are interested in club leadership positions or learning more about Rotary to attend the next Rotary Leadership Institute in Lexington on February 21 from 8:00 to 3:00. Breakfast and lunch are included, and the Club pays the \$70 registration fee. Treasurer-Elect Tom Bohnert introduced new members Geoff Campbell (Associate Head of School & Director of Advancement at Louisville Collegiate School), Jennifer Adrio (Regional CEO of American Red Cross Louisville Area Chapter) and Chambers Moore (Vice President / Relationship Manager at Hilliard Lyons Trust Company). Cynthia Knapek introduced UofL Head Baseball Coach Dan McDonnell. Dan delivered an inspiring address in which he talked about reading to his players and encouraging them to read as well. He motivates his team and staff with tips that he shared: \*Be the best you can be physically, mentally, spiritually; \*Two things that will change your life: Books you read and People you associate with.

Coach McDonnell also provided a list of books that he recommends for players staff and friends: *The Compound Effect* by Darren Hardy; *The Encore Effect* by Mark Sanborn; *All In, The Circle Maker*, and *In a Pit with a Lion on a Snowy Day* by Mark Batterson; *Greatest Salesman in the World* by Og Mandino; *Noticer, Travelers Gift* and *The Butterfly Effect* by Andy Andrews; and *Soup, Training Camp* and *Positive Dog* by Jon Gordon. Other book titles he recommended were: *Toughness, The Gold Standard, When the Game Stands Tall, Lone Survivor, American Sniper, Unbroken, Help the Helper*, and *Coming Back Strong*.

Coach McDonnell recommended a website to "help you win Monday mornings": <a href="www.drelko.com">www.drelko.com</a>. He also explained the Walmart Challenge, and how it changed his life. Another important tip is to sleep in on the front end – early to bed, early to rise. Those are the keys to UofL Baseball bringing home seven Championship rings over the last eight seasons. He closed his remarks with a view of the team's 2015 schedule. Dan answered several questions before the meeting was adjourned.
