
Joe Hinrichs has been Executive Vice President and President of The Americas, Ford Motor Company since Dec. 1, 2012. Prior to this, he served as Group VP and President of Asia Pacific and Africa where he led Ford's Asia Pacific growth plan overseeing the construction of nine new manufacturing plants and spearheading a commitment to bring more than 50 new vehicles and powertrains to the region by mid-decade. He oversaw all of Ford's operations and partnerships within the Asia Pacific and Africa region, including those with Changan, JMC, and Mazda. Hinrichs was named the 2013 Fortune Magazine Reader's Choice winner as Businessperson of the Year for the automotive industry. He was also named one of the ten inaugural winners of the Shanghai Pudong Business Person of the Year award in 2013 in recognition of his leadership in growing Ford's business in China. He was the recipient of the

2008 Shien-Ming Wu Manufacturing Leadership Award (recognizes manufacturing leaders for visionary and strategic thinking, courage and impact on the industry). Hinrichs was also named to Automotive News' 2007 All-Stars for Manufacturing. He was recognized for leading Ford's North American manufacturing team to help boost vehicle quality and improve plant productivity.

Hinrichs was a member of the Board of the Directors of the US China Business Council from 2010–2013. Hinrichs was co-chair of the Michigan March of Dimes WalkAmerica campaigns 2006–2009, co-chair of Ford's 2008 and 2009 Juvenile Diabetes campaign, and operating chairman of the Boy Scouts of America's 2007–2009 Friends of Scouting Leadership campaigns. Hinrichs was the 2013 Arthritis Foundation's Tribute to Excellence honoree celebrating his leadership in the community.

Born in Columbus, Ohio, Hinrichs earned a bachelor's degree in electrical engineering magna cum laude from the University of Dayton (Ohio) in 1989, and a master's degree in business administration from the Harvard Business School in 1994 as a GM Fellow. Hinrichs and his wife, Maria, have three children.

January 23, 2014 Rotary Meeting

The Rotary Club of Louisville meeting of January 23, 2014 was called to order by President Randy Coe. In beginning the Club's salute to the memory of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., our invocation was led by Walt Kunau who invoked some of the thoughts of Dr. King.

The pledge of allegiance was led by Bob Slider, who also led this week's musical number (provided by Club members), "Button up Your Overcoat," which was more than appropriate given the ongoing Polar Vortex that has invaded the Ohio Valley. Guests were introduced by Members, including a visiting Rotarian from Petoskey, Michigan. Nine members are celebrating birthdays this week, and three who were present were acknowledged and honored.

There were two items of official business presented to the Club for consideration. First, Club Past President Stuart Alexander was approved by the membership to stand as a candidate for Rotary District 6710 Governor. Second, Club Member


Rotary on the River!
