

On June 27, 2006, Dan McDonnell, one of the top young minds in college baseball, was named the 18th head coach of the University of Louisville baseball team. And on June 15, 2007, McDonnell and the Cardinals took the field at hallowed Rosenblatt Stadium in Omaha for game one of the 2007 College World Series.

As the first rookie head coach to lead his team to Omaha in 27 years, McDonnell was named National Coach of the Year by Rivals.com after guiding the Cardinals to a then-school record 47 wins during that 2007 season. He followed that impressive debut season by leading Louisville to six more NCAA appearances during the next seven years, including back-to-back College World Series berths in 2013 and

2014, as well as five conference regular season titles and two conference tournament championships. Louisville also hosted six different rounds of NCAA postseason baseball in the last eight years with NCAA Super Regionals in 2007 and 2014 and four NCAA Regionals in 2009, 2010, 2013 and 2014.

In McDonnell's eight seasons as head coach, Louisville ranks seventh nationally in wins with 359, including a school-record 51 wins in 2013. During the eight-year span, the Cardinals have produced 18 All-Americans, 61 all-conference selections, five conference Pitcher of the Year winners and three conference Player of the Year winners, while 40 Louisville players have signed professional contracts after being selected in the Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft.

McDonnell graduated from The Citadel in 1992 and later completed his master's degree in business administration in 1995. He is married to the former Julie Anne Underwood of Charlotte, N.C. The couple has two sons, Jake and Justin.

The first meeting of 2015 of the Rotary Club of Louisville began when President Kevin Wardell rang the bell at 12:10. He introduced Kelly Burke who provided the invocation. Pres Kevin reminded anyone who is interested in becoming a member to get more information at the 'What is Rotary' table in the back of the room at the end of the meeting. Pres Kevin presented the 2014-15 Lifetime Service Award to Craig Scherman! Craig accepted the award to a rousing standing ovation. In emotional remarks Scherman said, "I love Rotary. I have a passion for it. Thank you ... you've made my life special."

President Kevin then introduced Past President Bos Todd who gave the bio for our speaker, Bob Bordogna, Executive Vice President at Todd Asset Management. As Bob began speaking, word spread that the market was up 300 pts! Bob posed the following questions: Is the U.S. Economy slowing? Is the yield curve inverting? Are interest rates rising? Has the Fed started tightening? Is inflation trending up? Is the stock market expensive? Are corporate profits declin-

ing? Is market sentiment too bullish? The answer to them all was 'no'.


Bob mentioned that there are significant geopolitical risks as well as political instability in several Eurozone countries. Global growth is much more of a problem. The end of QE 3 seems likely to lead to increased volatility in the markets, adding that it's simply one more step on the road to restoring normalcy in the functioning of the capital markets. He views the turnover in Congress as a long-term positive. Bob summed it up by stating, "We have an economy that is growing at a moderate, sustainable rate, with low inflation, low interest rates, much lower energy costs, solid earnings growth, reasonable stock valuations and a monetary authority that promises to be 'patient' in the implementation of any tightening in monetary policy." With that in mind, Bob gifted us with his stock picks for 2015, listed below along with the results of Bob's forecast/actual report for last year.
