Title: "Sustainability of Higher Education in an Era of Budget Shortfalls"

After several years of challenges, the University of Louisville is making significant progress and is poised for great success in the future.

Dr. Postel has spent more than two decades at the university, serving in multiple leadership roles on its Health Sciences Campus before taking the reins as Interim President in January 2017.

Since that time, Dr. Postel and his administration have worked to overcome a \$48 million budget shortfall, ensured that the university is in full compliance with requirements of its accrediting body, reached an agreement for reforms with

tull compliance with requirements of its accrediting body, reached an agreement for reforms with the affiliated University of Louisville Foundation, cleaned up problems in the athletic department and brought management of the University of Louisville Hospital back in house. The University has seen applications rise, donor confidence return and students achieve new and exciting levels of success.

Still, the future of higher education is still largely uncertain. Funding cuts continue, and the demand for services grows each year. Dr. Postel will share his vision of how UofL, and higher education in general, will not only survive, but thrive, in these difficult times.


