For the last fifteen years Craig Buthod has been the director of the Louisville Free Public Library, serving Louisville through a central library, seventeen branches and two bookmobiles. Craig spends his time developing community support and creating special programs in community education.

Before coming to Louisville, Craig served as the senior executive for the Seattle Public Library and in a range of positions at the library in Tulsa, Oklahoma. He earned his degree in librarianship at the University of Denver and studied public administration at the University of Oklahoma. Two years ago, <u>Library Journal</u> named Craig Buthod Librarian of the Year for the United States.

The Louisville Free Public Library is growing. As personal technology has broadened the public's access to knowledge, the public library has become more essential than ever, with demand for its educational services

skyrocketing. At the same time, our library system is diversifying its product line, with free online services for students, businesses and the public at large. New libraries have been built in the Newburg, Fairdale and Shawnee neighborhoods, and a major library now under construction in Southwest Louisville is the first of three regional libraries to be built. Our library's future is bright.

July 11, 2013 Rotary Meeting

After President Randy called the meeting to order, leading us in an invocation was Tony Coffey. Tony continued with the USA theme from the Fourth of July. He asked for Blessings for our Country and its leaders. Next, a moment of silence and prayer was held in memory of George King, Sr. who served Rotary for 27 years. Jane Burks led us in the Pledge and Barbara Collins introduced our guest singers. Singing two selections were Jenna Ryan and Coady King. Birthday celebrants were introduced by Judy Handmaker. Before our program began, President Randy remembered Rotarian Bremer Ehrler who would have been 99 years old this day. He also recognized six Rotarians with ten years or more of service.

David Wood made the introduction of the guest speaker, Jason Chesney, M.D., Ph.D. He is Deputy Director of the Brown Cancer Center. Dr. Chesney opened with a sobering statistic. Kentucky is ranked #1 in cancer related deaths in the entire country. Cancer will kill 10 000 people in Kentucky this year along. Clebally, girlst million people with the country.

cer will kill 10,000 people in Kentucky this year alone. Globally, eight million people will die of cancer in 2013. That's 15 people per minute!

The Mission of the Brown Cancer Center is three-fold: 1) Reduce cancer deaths locally and globally; 2) Educate the next generation of cancer scientists and physicians; and 3) Provide the most advanced cancer therapeutics and diagnostics available.

Some exciting developments are being tested, including the ability to test for cancer via blood tests and not necessarily using more expensive CAT or PET scans. We also heard that cancer treatments are moving toward treatments that help your own immune system fight cancer. Of course, the cancer battle is expensive. Dr. Chesney talked about a tactic other metro areas are using to fund research, and that is having a five-cent tax on packages of cigarettes. That could raise as much as \$5 million annually in Louisville alone.

One final thing. When asked how to cure cancer at a local forum with Dr. Chesney, James Watson (the discoverer of DNA) said that clinics like the Brown Cancer Center must continue to do research that might have a low probability of success but a potential of a high payoff of helping people if it works. That is research that drug companies shy away from. We are blessed to have such an outstanding physician and researcher in our community to share his time with Rotarians! — Don Cherrie


