Jason Chesney, M.D., Ph.D. is the Deputy Director of the James Graham Brown Cancer Center at the University of Louisville. In this role he directs the largest Clinical Trials Program in Kentucky and coleads the center's Molecular Targets Program which is focused on the pre-clinical development of chemotherapeutic agents for introduction into phase I clinical trials.

In his presentation, Dr. Chesney will detail the high rate of cancer-related deaths in Kentucky and the need for innovative translational research to discover new drugs to combat cancer. He then will briefly describe novel agents that target the metabolism of cancer cells, new approaches to activate the immune system to kill cancer cells, practical interventions to enhance the dosing of chemo-preventative compounds and a biophysical method to ubiquitously detect cancer using a small amount of blood. Each of these exciting technologies were discovered by the center's researchers at the University of

Louisville and are currently undergoing clinical trial testing at multiple cancer centers.

Dr. Chesney's presentation will end with a description of discrete steps that are needed to enable us to continue to build on our international reputation and the economic impact of continued investment into cancer care and research in Louisville, Kentucky.




