Topic: Starting Up a Startup in Louisville

Rotary Leadership Fellow Maggie Galloway is leading a team that's building connected medical devices for emergency medicine providers. Their first device, the Inscope Laryngoscope, is a wireless disposable video laryngoscope with integrated and

controllable suction that makes emergency intubation safer for patients and easier for providers. Maggie's presentation will cover the rewards and challenges of getting a new company off the ground in Louisville, the process of idea synthesis, action planning, execution, and how to get an innovative product to market.

In February of 2015, Inscope Medical Solutions LLC won the 2015 Brown-Forman Cardinal Challenge for developing the OneScope. In May of 2015, Inscope Medical Solutions took first place from the Global Venture Labs Investment Competition, which featured teams from all over the world, including the U.S., Brazil, Norway, France, Hong Kong, Germany, Canada, Australia and several teams from Thailand. In addition to a \$25,000 cash prize and consulting time with the Director of Jon Burmley Texas Venture Labs, Maggie rang the Nasdaq closing bell in New York City on August 17. (Read more here)
