Born and raised in Panama, Aris Cedeño earned the degree of Attorney at Law and a B.A. in Literature at the University of Panama, where he taught political science before moving to the U.S. and obtaining his M.A. and Ph.D. in Spanish literature from Michigan State University.

In 1991, Aris joined the faculty of the University of Louisville and served that institution as an Associate Professor of Spanish Literature until 2010 when he left to devote his full time to the Governor's Scholars Program. In Academia, his research interests include natural law, literature of the nineteenth century, and the Romantic Movement. He has published and edited two books and several papers in these areas.

Dr. Cedeño joined the GSP as summer faculty in 1992 and has served the program in several capacities, including Campus Director (NKU 1995-2001), Academic Dean (1998-present), and Executive Director (2006-present).

Dr. Cedeño serves on the Board of the Kentucky Humanities Council and the National Association of Governors' Schools. He has completed appointments as an American Council on Education (A.C.E.) Fellow (2006-2007, University of Pittsburgh) and a Bingham Fellow (Louisville, 2012). In 2006, he was recognized as one of the 25 most influential Hispanics in Louisville by the Office of the Mayor.

Immigrant Family Info ...

Nar K'paw's family came to the United Sates from Burma. They left their home country of Burma because of the Burmese military attack on the Karen people. Before his family came to the United States, they lived for more than 20 years in a refugee camp in Thailand. Nar met his wife in that camp, where two of his children were born.

When refugees live in the camps, they are not allowed to leave the camp. The camp area is about four kilometers square, and there were more than 47,000 refugees living there. There were numerous problems, such as infectious diseases, and the facilities in the camp aren't adequate to provide for people living there. Since the family arrived here, they have been working hard to rebuild what they have lost and left behind. Nar and his family have used all their savings to buy this house, the first home they have ever owned. The family is excited and extremely grateful for the home repairs.

We are very appreciative of the \$5,000 grant provided by Kosair Charities to help fund the repairs and handicap ramps.
