A theme for our Club's 2014-2015 Rotary Year will be "wellness" and living a healthy lifestyle. This week's speaker, Dr. Louis Heuser MD, is a foremost authority on these topics. Dr. Heuser became acutely aware of the value of exercise in the 5th grade when he failed the President's physical fitness test. As class President this physical failure was embarrassing. It was at that moment, that Dr. Heuser dedicated himself to a life of fitness.

Dr. Heuser developed Heuser Health as he watched the overall health of Americans deteriorate. As Dr. Heuser got older his patients got sicker. Not from the diseases they were referred to him for, but they were sicker because they were getting fatter and fatter. They all had heart disease, hypertension, and diabetes. His breast cancer pa-

tients were not dying of breast cancer, they were dying of heart attacks. Dr. Heuser saw more and more patients with surgical complications of diabetes. Easy operations were made hard because of all the fat. No one in medicine was doing anything to help people prevent all these preventable diseases.

Dr. Heuser's interest in nutrition and exercise was the answer to this frustrating dilemma. Heuser Health was developed to help people help themselves by eating nutritious foods and exercising effectively; building fit, healthy, and vigorous bodies. Heuser Health is able to prevent 90% of the diseases Americans die from prematurely.

Dr. Heuser is a graduate of University of Florida BS 1972 and the University of Louisville Medical School 1984. Dr. Heuser was President of his private practice from 1986-2003. He has served as Chief of Surgery at Norton Hospital, and he is a current member of the Board of Trustees of Norton Healthcare.

June 20, 2014 Rotary Meeting

The Rotary Club of Louisville held its June 19, 2014 meeting in the Cochran Room with President Randy Coe presiding. The invocation was given by Bill Carrell. Joe Speiden led the Pledge of Allegiance and introduced the song, *In the Good Old Summertime*. Visiting Rotarians were introduced, and then Cyndi Caudill recognized the birthday table with Charlie Castner at the piano. President Randy surprised Charlie with a railroad-themed book which had been signed by the Board members. Randy then announced that the June 26 meeting would be held in Grand Ballroom A of Galt House East, with guest speaker Dr. Louis Heuser, CEO of Heuser Health Clinic.

President Randy thanked Mike Fallot and Keith Knapp and Rotarians who volunteered at the Repair Affair on June 14. Mike Fallot came forward to share details about the immigrant homeowners and the repairs provided by the Repair Affair team. President Randy also thanked Joey Bailey for making the annual Rotary Day at the BATS possible. A video of the first pitch by Greg Braun was shown.

President Randy remembered Rotarians who had passed away during this fiscal

year — Barry Ceridan, D.D.S. and Edward O'Brien. He also congratulated members celebrating milestone anniversaries: 40 years—Robert Ewald, David Reed, Craig Scherman, Dr. Harry Stambaugh; 45 years—Bussy Short; and 50 years—Bill Brittain and Niels Ewing. President Randy then surprised George Brakmeier with a well-deserved 'Service Above Self' award. *See details in article below.* Randy thanked the 2013-14 Board members for their service. He also accepted the Paul Harris Fellow on behalf of Christe Coe, first member of the Heuser Community Leadership Society. And, Randy thanked members for their generous donations during the Foundation Football and College Basketball fundraisers.

Christen Boone introduced Dr. Aris Cedeño, Director and Academic Dean of the Governor's Scholars Program. Dr. Cedeño provided details about the program, a summer residential program for outstanding high school students in Kentucky who are rising seniors. Its mission is to enhance Kentucky's next generation of civic and economic leaders. Students who are selected attend the program without charge. Students must be nominated, and the applications are rated as follows: 30% Academic Achievement (GPA, standardized tests, difficulty of course load); 30% Student Profile (extracurricular activities, service and honors/awards); 20% Writing Entry; 10% Teacher Recommendation; and 10% Community Recommendation. The first class in 1983 numbered 230 and was housed on one college campus. The program has grown to over 1,000 students on three campuses. As of October 2013, 25,349 students had completed the Governor's Scholars Program.

The meeting ended with door prize drawings and recitation of the 4-Way Test.
