June 20, 2013 Rotary Meeting

Janet Lively Heberle opened the meeting with the invocation. Ed Binford led the pledge and President-elect Randy announced a trial recital of the Four-Way Test by all in attendance. We were ably led by long-time member, Charlie Herd. Ed Binford then led the singing of another ancient classic, "Roll out the Barrel". John Jennings and Todd Warren were saluted at the birth-day table and Bob Michael brought the singing of the birthday song out of exile. President-elect Randy thanked the volunteers for last week's REPAIR AFFAIR event and then recognized Barbara Sexton Smith, CEO and President of the Fund for the Arts, for the national award she received in Pittsburgh last week. The Michael Newtown Award was given at the Americans for the Arts annual convention. President Randy called Barbara a "positive force for our community" to enthusiastic applause from the members.

Joey Bailey reminded everyone of the Rotary Day at the Bats on June 26. Mike Kull gave an up-

date of the Rotary Foundation of Rotary International. He announced a new grants program launching July 1st, following three years of test cities. Janet Lively Heberle returned to the podium to introduce our newest member, Erin Rasinen, Business Development Executive for Messer Construction Co. Erin's very impressive resume included many directorships for important service organizations and a stint as a Leadership Louisville Fellow. Janet then gave a very personal endorsement of Erin as a friend and quality person.

Ray Strothman introduced our guest speaker, Craig Richard, the newly appointed CEO of Greater Louisville Incorporated, GLI. Craig and his family came to Louisville in January from Houston, TX where Craig served as Chief Economic Development Officer for the Greater Houston Partnership. Craig brings more than 16 years of experience and Chamber leadership to his new position. He also brings enthusiasm, energy and an engaging leadership as evidenced by his excellent presentation. Craig has hit the ground running. Since January he has met with over 200 business leaders while launching a vision-casting process for the future. He cited the four areas of competitive strength for metro Louisville – advanced manufacturing, innovative health care, logistics and distribution, and branded food and beverage. He advocated for the continued emphasis on raising education standards and graduation rates and for the local sales tax option to fund key projects. Currently, 88 of the 102 largest U.S. cities have the local option. Craig focused on strategic planning and how GLI can support and complement Mayor Fischer's 25-year Vision Plan. After three years of planning, GLI will partner with Atlanta-based Market Street Services, a prominent business development consulting company. Under Craig's leadership, the process will yield a roadmap for growth and development. A steering committee, led by Steve Williams of Norton Healthcare, will guide the process. Craig concluded with the exhortation to "make no *little* plans". An enthusiastic Rotary audience concurred wholeheartedly. — Steven L. Schmidt
