

Rebecca Matheny is the Executive Director of the Louisville Downtown Partnership. A native Louisvillian, she returned home from Boston in 2003. A graduate of Trinity University in San Antonio, TX, she did Masters work in Urban and Environmental Policy at Tufts University in Medford, MA. After beginning her career in affordable housing, she switched focus to Downtown Louisville in 2007 when she joined the staff of the Downtown Development Corporation. Her professional focus has been intergovernmental relations, deregulation and policy development, project planning and implementation and strategic and master planning.

Rebecca has a long record of civic engagement, including as Board Chair of YMCA Camp Piomingo, and membership on the YMCA Association Board, Parking Authority of Louisville Board, Greater Louisville, Inc., Friends of the Waterfront, Gallopalooza, Cherokee Triangle Association, Highland Presby-


