

A seventh generation Kentuckian, Kent Whitworth joined the Kentucky Historical Society (KHS) as executive director in January 2004. KHS currently is focused on fulfilling an aggressive three-year strategic plan designed to: (1) make KHS a significant resource for the production of historical works, the promotion of historical understanding, and history education; (2) develop and strengthen statewide collaborative relationships that connect with and support key institutions and audiences; (3) become a customer-driven organization; and (4) diversify and grow KHS funding. Prior to joining KHS, Kent served for nine years as the director of the East Tennessee Historical Society. He entered the history profession in 1986 as the director of Blount Mansion, a National Historic Landmark in Knoxville, Tennessee.

Whitworth has a B.A. in History from Asbury University, where he served as director of marketing and public relations for four years. He earned an M.A. in History with an emphasis in Historic Preservation from Middle Tennessee State University. Kent participated in the Seminar for Historical Administration in 1990. He served on the Council for the American Association for State and Local History and is a 2007 graduate of Leadership Kentucky. Kent and his wife, Sarah, have two children – Andrew and Margaret.

McKnight, who began his presentation with a four-minute video (CLICK HERE to view) which highlighted the past, present and future of the Forecastle Music Festival. J.K. founded Forecastle in 2002, which has grown from a neighborhood event to one of the country's most anticipated summer festivals, drawing tens of thousands from around the world. At least 75,000 attendees are anticipated at this year's event. A recent study revealed that the 2013 Festival alone pumped \$14 million into the Louisville economy. The Rolling Stone magazine selected Forecastle as one of the "Coolest Festivals" and lists it in their "Summer 2014 40 Must-See Music Festivals". This year's festival will be held July 18-20. Check out the details at forecastlefest.com. McKnight also founded the Forecastle Foundation in 2011. Its mission is to identify and rebuild the most biologically diverse and endangered areas on the planet. One dollar from every festival ticket is donated to this mission.
