

Presentation Title: "The Story of Pappy Van Winkle Rourbon"

Julian will tell the story of the Van Winkle family in the bourbon business. This starts with Julian's grandfather, Julian P. Van Winkle, Sr. getting a job as a salesman with the W. L. Weller Wholesale

company in Louisville in 1893. Julian will explain how the popularity of the brand happened. His father started the Old Rip Van Winkle label in the mid 70's. Julian went on to create the Pappy Van Winkle label in the mid 90's. Since then, it has become one of the most sought after spirits in the world. There is no one or two things that made this happen. It was luck, a lot of help from friends and some whiskey skills that brought this brand to where it is today. Julian is amazed at what has happened with this brand, especially since 15 years ago, the bottles were collecting dust on liquor store shelves.



# May 31, 2018 - ROTARY MEETING RECAP



Our May 31st Rotary Club meeting featured Lisa Bajorinas - VP of **Entrepreneurship & Talent at Greater** Louisville, Inc (GLI) Lisa opened with emphasis on the point that innovation is the fuel of economic growth, and GLI's Enterprise Corp is committed to supporting and encouraging innovation on the entrepreneurial and investment side of the equation. She pointed to Enterprise Corp's innovation-driving initiatives achieved in the preceding 18 months - 288 start-ups served, 239 students impacted, 70 start-ups funded and \$28 million in investments secured. Lisa said that GLI can claim the

origination of naming and tracking "Million Dollar Babies," which are start-ups that either raise at least \$1 million in an investment round or earn their first \$1 million in sales revenue. She reported that 17 Million Dollar Babies were achieved in 2017, surpassing the goal of 10. Lisa revealed the planning and current construction of a new Entrepreneur Center at 900 E Main street, that will open later this year. She concluded her presentation by encouraging the Louisville business community to get involved in supporting entrepreneurship, specifically with these calls to action:

- Participate in a Startup Pilot test
- Invest in a Startup
- Follow on Social Media @EnterpriseLou and @StartupLou
