## Presentation Title: "If I Ruled the World"

Tori Murden McClure is the President of Spalding University. She is a graduate of Smith College. She holds a Masters in Divinity from Harvard Divinity School, a Juris Doctorate from the University of Louisville Brandeis School of Law, and a Masters of Fine Arts in Writing from Spalding University. Her book, "A Pearl in the Storm," was published by Harper Collins. Tori may be best known as the first woman and first American to row solo and unassisted across the Atlantic Ocean. Also, she was the first woman and first American to travel over land to the geographic South Pole. Tori and her husband Charles, better known as "Mac," reside in Louisville, Kentucky.

## JUNE 14. 2018 - ROTARY MEETING RECAP



Our June 14th Rotary Club meeting featured Dr. John Hale, Director of Liberal Studies at U of L. Dr. Hale provided an overview of how successful civilizations fail, using the Roman Empire as an example. At its height, the Roman Empire covered a geographical area that constitutes 27 modern countries today - from English/Scottish borders to Mesopotamia. Reasons for the decline of the Roman Empire included: (1) crisis of leadership; (2) military defeats; (3) economic instability; (4) the introduction of new religions to the region; (5) demographic change; and (6) the introduction of multiculturalism. Dr. Hale shared photos and

tales of his travels, "digs," and uncovered treasures. He concluded his presentation by answering questions from Rotarians.
