About Dr. Amanda Higgins:

A Kentuckian by birth and by choice, Amanda Higgins earned her PhD in American History from the University of Kentucky in 2013. She currently serves as the Community Engagement Administrator at the Kentucky Historical Society, where she oversees statewide outreach efforts and helps local history organizations achieve their goals. She lives in Lexington with her husband and two daughters.

2020 is the centennial of white women gaining the right to vote in national elections. It is also the 150th anniversary of the ratification of the 15th amendment, which affirmed the right to vote for all US citizens regardless of race, color or previous condition of servitude. As we rightfully celebrate these important constitutional amendments, we fail their promise by not telling more inclusive histories at our public cultural sites. How do we do this and what is the visitor's role in helping sites do this sort of work? How do we celebrate the expansion of the electorate while acknowledging shortcomings? Dr. Higgins will answer these questions and share a few examples of how we can work together to create and sustain more inclusive narratives of our shared past.

February 27th Meeting Recap:

Cynthia Knappek, President of the Leadership Louisville Center, provided an informative presentation regarding the future of leadership which she titled "Kicking Some Glass: Leadership Traits for the 21st Century." Cynthia provided data about what people look for in a leader and that the inclination tends to be female. She also discussed stumbling blocks that are prevalent which make it difficult for women to move up in their field as well as gaps that create the biggest challenge in gender parity. She ended her presentation by identifying key strategies that can help bridge those gaps such as building confidence, courage and a better connection with male allies.

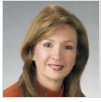
