

UNSUNG HEROES Annual Recognition Program

Rotary's motto is "Service Above Self", and the Unsung Hero Recognition Program encourages youth to excel in this area while working behind the scenes and seldom, if ever, stepping into the limelight. Rotary will honor and publicly recognize high school seniors from 51 public, private and parochial schools in Jefferson County. These students will receive \$250 and a certificate of achievement, as well as vouchers for art/civic centers and restaurants (i.e., Actors Theatre, Kentucky Opera, Louisville Ballet, Louisville Zoo, Louisville Science Center, Louisville Bats Baseball, Kentucky Derby Museum, Texas Roadhouse and Skyline Chili). All Unsung Hero recipients and finalists who are pursuing a post-secondary education in Jefferson County will be eligible to apply for Rotary scholarships from Bellarmine University, Spalding University, University of Louisville, and Jefferson Community and Technical College. Scholarships range from \$1,000 to \$16,000 for a total of \$42,000.

The Unsung Heroes Project Chair is Craig Scherman. Thursday's program emcee is Kevin Smith, and other Rotarians involved are: Ray Strothman. accounting services; Bob Niblock, judging; Arne Judd, scholarships. Since its beginning 15 years ago, over \$700,000 has been given away by Metro Louisville Rotary Club Charities, Inc., which includes The Rotary Club of Louisville and other seven Rotary clubs in the area: Buechel/Fern Creek, East Louisville Sunrise, Jeffersontown, Prospect/Goshen, Southwest, South Louisville and St. Matthews. Kosair Charities is also a financial partner in this initiative.

According to school administrators, the Unsung Hero Recognition Program generates many positive results to their school and community because it stresses the importance of student volunteerism. Our involvement enables Rotary to be known as an organization that cares about the future of youth in our community, and that we are investing in the next generation of decision makers.

March 19, 2015 Rotary Meeting

President-elect Greg Braun opened the meeting with an explanation that President Wardell was 'under the weather'. Greg was sure that ongoing 'March Madness' games being held this week was just a coincidence. Mark Trier provided the invocation and Ken Grossman led the pledge and Rotary 4-Way Test, with some controversy about Ken's blue (or green?) necktie.

President-elect Greg introduced singer/songwriter/guitarist Tyrone Cotton who entertained with a song. Members introduced their guests and John Jennings introduced the birthday celebrants. Greg reminded Rotarians to register and pay online for the April 28 Day at the Downs tickets. Past President Stetten promoted the May 12 FUNdraiser at Copper & Kings, and requested additional auction item donations. President-elect Greg recognized and presented David Dick a new Paul Harris Fellow pin with an added stone which represented an additional \$1,000 donation he had made to Rotary International's foundation.


Before Barry Denton (Executive Director of the Louisville Metro Police Foundation) introduced Metro Police Chief Steve Conrad, he informed Rotarians that our Club had been under investigation for some time. To everyone's surprise, Barry reported that three criminals had been discovered among us: Randy 'Gunslinger' Coe, Grea 'Bugsy' Braun and Kevin 'Pimp Daddy' Wardell. Who knew? Barry introduced Chief Steve Conrad who provided crime statistics in our community. Approximately 100,000 arrests were made in the past 12 months. As of now, approximately 21 murders are unsolved. The anonymous tip line is 574-LMPD. Conrad said, "The number of arrests is important but, if we are to reach the goal to make Louisville the safest city in America, we are all going to need to get involved." It's a complicated problem. Poverty, drugs, addiction and the failure of institutions that should help (i.e., schools, churches and the criminal justice system) ... we have all dropped the ball. He referred to Mayor Fischer's plan, 'Blueprint for Safe and Healthy Neighborhoods' (available online at THIS LINK). Chief Conrad stressed the importance of education, after-school programs and the need for mentors for children who do not have good role models. He challenged all Rotarians to get involved and volunteer as mentors, and be the ones who make a difference in the lives of these children. Conrad completed his presentation to provide plenty of time for Q&A. When asked about his views regarding heroin bills now in KY legislature, he responded: "Let's pass one!" and much applause ensued. He stated that heroin related arrests have risen 40 percent since last year, but added that locking up addicts is not the answer. They must be treated. He added that needle exchange is a big deal. Addicts are contracting diseases, and police officers are being exposed to potential diseases during arrests. Chief Conrad reported that a \$3 million investment will be made to arm police officers with cameras. The cameras will be affixed to officers' glasses, hats or collars. These cameras will provide transparency and enhance the public's trust of the LMPD. No one won the Pot O' Gold, so the \$\$ total continues to climb higher!




Rotary Club Service Day and Outdoor Lunch with Food Literacy Project - Saturday, May 30 at 10 am
