Fr. Clyde Crews retired from Bellarmine's theology faculty in 2007. In that same year, he was appointed to a new position as Bellarmine University's Historian and Archival Coordinator. His many publications include *American and Catholic: A Popular History of Catholicism in the United States* (St. Anthony Messenger Press, 2004) and *Ultimate Questions: A Theological Primer* (Paulist Press, 1986). Fr. Crews is a graduate of St. Xavier High School and earned a B.A. degree from Bellarmine in 1966, graduating summa cum laude. As a Woodrow Wilson Fellowship recipient, he received his M.A. and Ph.D. in History of Christian Thought at Fordham University, New York City. He was ordained a priest of the Archdiocese of Louisville after pastoral study at St. Meinrad Seminary. Returning to Bellarmine as a theology professor in 1973, he has served in

numerous roles including historian-in-residence, director of the Merton Center, chairman of the Theology department and academic dean. In addition, he frequently has been a consultant on numerous historical and museum projects.

In commemoration of our Club's 100th anniversary, this program is another in our series of programs with a historical perspective. You will enjoy Fr. Crews' incredible insights into the religious history of our community.

President Stuart Alexander welcomed everyone, and Leadership Fellow Katie Hoy's invocation spoke of spring and renewal. Tom Bohnert led us in the Pledge and we rollicked along with the Rotary band's rendition of "Mountain of Love," with Tom as its front man. We had twelve guests but no visiting Rotarians. Larry Sloan recognized three members at the Birthday Table (and six who weren't, including 93 year-old E.J. O'Brien.) We wished them a Happy Birthday.

President Stuart again reminded us that Rotary Day at the Downs is Thursday, April 30. Also upcoming are the May 17 Dinner/Auction Event, and May 18 Family Fun Picnic. Whew! And we still need auction items! Our next meeting will be in the Galt House West's Cochran Room on April 4. Fr. Clyde Crews, Bellarmine University Historian and Archival Coordinator, will be our speaker.

Barbara Sexton Smith introduced new member Mark Hogg. President Stuart introduced Randy Coe, our President-Elect, who told us about big changes in our committee structure. The changes are driven by our responses in recent surveys. Whether you wish to lead or follow, the Leadership Development Committee wants to know your preferences in this brave new world.

Randy Coe introduced our guest speaker, Berea College's ninth president, Dr. Lyle Roelofs, who told us about Berea College's extraordinary history and its mission to advance educational opportunity regardless of color, sex, or wealth. Dr. Roelofs explained Berea's mission in terms of the "Great Commitment" first articulated fifty years ago. Based on Berea's founding Abolitionist precepts and philosophy, the "Great Commitments" are an evolving expression of Berea's goals and objectives (currently eight). They are informed by the rubric of "learning, labor and service," and the Biblical motto, "God has made of one blood all peoples [or 'all nations of men'] on earth." Dr. Roelofs said that Berea's founders distinguished between merely taking a position and making a commitment "to act in the world, which carries consequences." One hundred and fifty years later, Berea adheres to its founders' principles. Each of its 1,600 students provides labor to contribute to the school's general welfare. None pays tuition. Although its students' labor helps defray costs, the college's billion-dollar endowment enables the school to continue that tradition.


